Approach

Stage 1: Establish a core group of UG researchers and a broader undergraduate research community with an interest in higher education learning and teaching

- Research will begin in Semester 1, 2013.
- Students will publish their research in newsletters and peer reviewed journals.

Stage 2: Establish the Macquarie Undergraduate Research Student Society. The society will:

- Run seminars, displays, stalls in O-Week, and social activities
- Attract university resources for publicity and incidental expenditures
- Lobby for changes to curricula, including UG research experiences within departments

Stage 3: Plan and run the Second Australasian Conference of Undergraduate Research (ACUR) in 2013.

- Drawing on the first ACUR in September 2012
- Interdisciplinary conference with poster presentations and spoken papers by undergraduates



Evaluation

The core group of UG researchers and the Steering Group will work through successive action research cycles of reflection and action.
