

Undergraduate Research News Australasia (URNA)

Policy

1. *Undergraduate Research News Australasia* is the Newsletter of the Australasian Council for Undergraduate Research.
2. The Newsletter publishes short articles about research undertaken by undergraduate students, information about current activities and practices of the Australasian Council for Undergraduate Research and related organisations, and news of upcoming events.
3. The Newsletter may be referred to as 'URNA' where it is clear that this refers to *Undergraduate Research News Australasia*.
4. Publication priority is given to items relating to the activities of the Australasian Council for Undergraduate Research, and items submitted by its members.
5. Editorial decisions are taken by the Editor and must be complied with. The Editor reserves the right to make editorial changes to submissions where necessary.
6. *Undergraduate Research News Australasia* is normally published twice a year in May and November. These dates and the frequency of publication may be varied according to circumstances.
7. Undergraduate Research News Australasia is distributed widely under Creative Commons license CC BY-NC-ND 4.0. By publishing in URNA authors automatically give their permission for The Australasian Council for Undergraduate Research to publish their work under this license.
